"We are honored to work with this inspiring team of athlete ambassadors who are making an impact both on and off the field, and we will be proudly cheering for them on the Road to Paris 2024," said Thierry Jupsin, Vice President of Brand Marketing, Bridgestone Europe, Middle East and Africa (EMEA). "These individuals truly embody our belief that what really matters is enabling all people to perform at their best regardless of background or ability — not just today, but for years to come."

The roster of athletes was selected based on an alignment of values with the Bridgestone brand. The personal stories and passions of Team Bridgestone ambassadors will be celebrated and amplified by the company through a combination of marketing initiatives, employee and customer events, and community activities on the journey to Paris.

Firestone adds new sustainably-sourced raw materials to race tires for the Indianapolis 500



The Firestone brand is celebrating 25 years as the exclusive tire supplier of the NTT INDYCAR SERIES and the Indianapolis 500. As we look to help sustain the sport into the future, Bridgestone is once again accelerating the use of more sustainable materials and technologies in motorsports.

For 2024, Bridgestone has produced a Firestone Firehawk Indy 500 race tire that incorporates two monomers sourced from the waste residue of palm oil processing. The bio-styrene and butadiene monomers included in this year's race tires are certified by the International Sustainability and Carbon Certification (ISCC) for the transparency and traceability of sustainable raw materials throughout the supply chain.*

"Our racing heritage with Firestone dates back more than 100 years to the very first Indy 500 in 1911, and we remain focused on helping sustain the sport we love for future generations," said **Cara Krstolic**, Executive Director of Race Tire Engineering and Production, Bridgestone Americas. "The demands of racing also offer the ultimate challenge for our innovation. In proving the same premium performance can be delivered at this level through more sustainable materials and technologies, we can work to extend these efforts beyond motorsports into solutions being designed for the future of mobility."

Using sustainably sourced monomers in this year's Indy 500 race tires is the latest example of Bridgestone's efforts to prove and accelerate sustainable materials and technologies through the NTT INDYCAR SERIES.

Bridgestone's "Airfree" tire takes first public road test



Since 2008, our BSJ teammates have been developing Bridgestone's "Airfree Concept", a next-generation tire that doesn't require air inflation – and brings major benefits as a result.

By design, an air-free tire overcomes arguably the biggest threat to tire safety, longevity and cost efficiency: punctures. And with no air pressure management required, the air-free tire reduces maintenance demands to provide further savings. But really the most important benefit introduced by this new concept tire is in recyclability. Bridgestone's Airfree Concept tire applies resin-made spokes and tread rubber – both fully recyclable – alongside a retreadable surface.

"We have realized a sustainable business model with Airfree," says Yoshida-san, Manager of Bridgestone Corporation's Solution Development Section 5, who oversees the Airfree Concept's design. But the over 15-year project hasn't been without its challenges.

"At the time of development in 2008, it was made of metal and had a much more complicated structure than today," says Yoshida-san. "However, that presented a productivity challenge, and we decided to use thermoplastic resin, or roughly speaking, plastic, as the material.

"Then, we struggled to maintain the recyclability of the resin while at the same time making it function as a tire that supports the vehicle."

After overcoming many challenges and setbacks, the revolutionary tire would be taken from the B-Mobility course in Kodaira, Tokyo, and driven on public roads for the first time earlier this year – a major moment on its roadmap to public rollout. The public road test is key for any new tire or vehicle, but especially in the case of a first-of-its-kind air-free tire. On public roads, vehicles will face issues they won't encounter on the track – like ruts, manholes and fallen leave – so by running in such road environments the team would gain new insights into the tire's performance.

The date was set for 27 March 2024 and the location Tokyo's Kodaira City.

But before that – specifically, the day before – an internal test ride event was held for related departments within BSJ. Testers commented that the handling performance was the same as that of passenger car tires on the market, and that although the ride was at times stiff, the tires felt well supported, allowing them to drive with peace of mind.

The Airfree Concept's public road test would help to verify the tire's characteristics and functions on various road surfaces and road environments.

"By going out on public roads, our hope is to gain new insights that we didn't notice during the test runs at B-Mobility and link them to improvements," says Yoshida-san. "We would also like to improve the ride quality in the future."

The tire's public road test is a significant milestone on not only its own journey, but also Bridgestone's as we work toward a more sustainable future of mobility.

And now we can safely drop the word "Concept" from the tire's name!

The JOLLEY TROLLEY has a route which operates daily on Clearwater Beach and south for many miles down to the famous turn of the 20th, Century pink DON CESAR hotel. The service also operates to the north stopping at the following locations: (It is free if you show them your room key). Clearwater, Old downtown Dunedin, Old Palm Harbor and the historical sponging and fishing village of Tarpon Springs. This is about a twelvemile ride. You will be able to board this shuttle right outside the hotel lobby (we repeat show your room key for a free ride) and go north with a great view through Clearwater, home of the Scientologists (watch for them with black slacks and white tops) and then along the water with great water views to **Dunedin, a big tourist stop** for many visitors...with its restored downtown full of shops and fine restaurants. You will then proceed through Old Palm Harbor. You may want to stop in Dunedin, on your way back from Tarpon Springs, if time allows as it is a place worth visiting or for lunch if it is still early. You can get on and off the trolley wherever you desire and catch the next one. You head north to the antique district of Tarpon Springs, a turn of the century village, where you may want to get off to visit the shops, re-board another trolley and then on to the water front with its sponge docks, shrimp and sponge boats, boat tours, shops, great restaurants...and magnificent history. The trolley tour will take you past many old and historical landmarks. You may want to get off here, especially at the sponge docks to visit the shops and restaurants, dine on the water or just stay on for the tour through this Greek Village in Florida. This is a true ethnic Greek community just as they exist in Greece.

WHY ARE WE CALLED THE GUM DIPPERS?

We are called the Firestone Gum Dippers. Do we all know where this name came from? Gum Dipping was a process that Firestone used in the manufacture of tires. Much of the credit for Firestones technological base goes to Chemist John W. Thomas. Thomas was hired as the company's first research director in 1908. His work was so respected that

Thomas eventually led the corporation as its president and later as chairman of the board. One key development under Thomas's leadership was the process of *GUM-DIPPING* cord fabric. In 1915, the search for increased tire strength led to the first experiments using cord fabric for tire plies instead of square-woven cloth previously used. More flexible and resilient, cords proved a great improvement, doubling a tire's life. However, internal friction created intense heat buildup, which caused the tire to separate. This could be a major disaster. We found this out again in later years with steel cord. In 1920, Firestone's engineers finally perfected a method of "*GUM-DIPPING*" cords to completely impregnate them with rubber, insulating them against heat build-up and ply separation and increasing the life of the tire. One good turn deserved another and along with dramatically improving tire wear and resiliency. "*GUM-DIPPING*" allowed for another major Firestone first, the balloon, or low-pressure tire. Softer balloon tires made the hard tire casing a thing of the past. Within a few years Firestone's balloon tire was the standard tire for the world. All Firestone tires were branded "*GUM DIPPED*" for years and years. Are they still branded "*GUM DIPPED*"? *Take a look!*

Our group was originally called the "Twenty Year Club" when first organized in 1980, as you had to have been a Firestone employee that long. They began to refer to themselves as the Gum Dippers in some of the literature starting with a post reunion newsletter on November 1, 1984. In 1992 they started to call themselves the Gum Dippers." The name "Gum Dippers" first appeared on our letterhead in 1995.
